State ballot candidate information is provided by the Maine Department of the Secretary of State. The Democratic, Green Independent and Republican Parties each have a separate primary ballot. Candidates are grouped by office and party, with the parties appearing alphabetically and the candidates listed alphabetically for each office and party grouping. If no candidate is listed for one or more parties for an office, that means there is no candidate for that office. A voter can choose to write-in and vote for an undeclared candidate.
