**IN MEMORIAM**

**Clarida M. VanDyne**  
*December 19, 1919*  
*- April 12, 2011*



MILO AND PORTLAND - Clarida M. VanDyne, 91, wife of the late Henry G. VanDyne of Bradford, died April 12, 2011, at a Portland nursing home after a decade-long struggle with Alzheimer's disease. She was born Dec. 19, 1919, in Ashland, to James and Gertrude (Berube) Brasslett, and by all accounts almost immediately defined herself with two traits she carried with her for life: helpfulness and handiwork. She held several jobs from a young age to contribute to the family well being before marrying the son of a potato farmer and moving to Bradford in the waning days of the Depression. Working tirelessly together, Henry and Clarida built a dairy farm with a statewide reputation for efficiency and excellence, winning Dairymen of the Year for the state of Maine in 1970. Individually, Clarida gained local celebrity for the creativity, quantity and quality of her wedding cakes, braided rugs, dresses, sweaters, quilts and gardens. She won a national quilting award from Ladies Home Journal in 1996. "Gram embodied epic, timeless values of virtue, honesty, frugality, ingenuity, loyalty, goodwill and unconditional love, just to name a few," said her grandson, Paul Tukey of Cumberland. "She really was a heroic human being, never idle during waking hours, never wasting a nickel, and never, ever, saying no to anyone in need. The heirlooms created from her hands will outlive us all." She is survived by a daughter, Charlotte Tukey of Falmouth; a son and daughter-in-law, Garry and Evelyn VanDyne of Rockland; one sister, Laura Knox of Kenduskeag; five other grandchildren, Randy Tukey of Cumberland, Jill Tukey of Portland, Lynn Bauchinger of South Portland, Jeremy VanDyne of Matinicus and Jody Landrith of Rockport; and 11 great-grandchildren. She was predeceased by three brothers, Angus, James and Timothy Brasslett, all of Bradford; and six sisters, Bell Berube of Presque Isle, Esther M. Carle of Brownville Junction, Olive Moulton of Alton, Cecile Delaite of Milo, Gertrude Amero of Milo and Theresa Tibbetts of Howland. Fred Mayo farm before joining the U.S. Navy in 1945. After serving in Hawaii, he returned to Dover-Foxcroft where he married Edie and raised his family. He went to work for Stowell MacGregor spool mill, and apprenticed under Harry Boober for filing saws; it served him well for many years. When Stowell MacGregor consolidated with their Dixfield operation, Elwood went to work at Pride Manufacturing, Guilford. He expanded his skills to filing band saws and worked there 20 years, retiring in 1984. After his retirement he continued to sharpen saws in his shop at home for another 25 years. His hobbies invariably revolved around using his hands. Whether it was welding action figures, making bird houses, gardening, playing horseshoes, or simply crafting something from a scrap piece of wood, his creativity was often displayed. His sense of humor was a delight to everyone who visited with him, especially his grandchildren who were often entertained with his harmonica or jew's-harp. Elwood is survived by his wife, Edie; three children, Swan Colpitts of Alamogordo, N.M., Gail Bozzell and her husband, Al, of Finksburg, Md., and Alan Hussey and his wife, Mary, of Sturbridge, Mass.; two brothers, George and Bob, both of Milo; four grandchildren, three great-grandchildren, many nieces, nephews and cousins.
