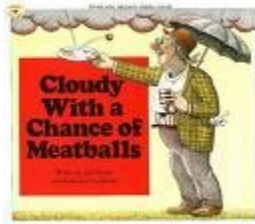

We have had a busy week at the library. On Monday there was a trustees' meeting. Trustees present were Melanie Hussey, chair; Joanne DeWitt, secretary; Jerry Cole, technical coordinator, Theda Cowing, George Fricke, and Elaine Tardiff. Also present were Jeffrey Gahagan, town manager, and Judith Macdougall, library director. **IN MEMORIAM**

**ALLAN E. HORNE**

MILO - Allan E. Horne, 93, husband of Norma (Greene ) Horne, died May 2, 2008, at the Maine Veterans Home in Bangor. He was born March 5, 1915, in Milo, the son of Maurice C. and Dicea M. (Henderson) Horne. He graduated from Milo High School, Class of 1932, and the University of Maine with a B.A. Degree in Economics in 1937, where he was a member of Kappa Sigma

fraternity. He was working with the U.S. Immigration Service in Philadelphia, PA, when he was drafted into the U.S. Navy and served as radar man on the destroyer U.S. Vesoli during World War II. After the war he returned home and entered the family business of M.C. Horne and Sons and developed a heating and plumbing business. He owned and published a local newspaper, "The Tri River Photo News". He belonged to Rabboni Masonic Lodge No. 62 in Milo, and had received his 50 year pin. He was a member of Aldworth Chapter No. 39 OES, the Joseph P. Chaisson American Legion Post No. 41, also in Milo, and had also received his 50 year pin. He had served as Piscataquis County Commissioner and on many county and state committees during this time. He also served on the Milo Board of Trade, the Milo School Board, the Three Rivers Fish and Game Club, and the Piscataquis Extension. He was an avid fly fisherman and outdoorsman. He and his wife traveled extensively throughout the United States and had spent 11 winters in Zephyrhills, FL.

He is survived by his wife, Norma of Milo; 2 sons, Norman "Tom" C. Horne and his wife Carol of Boyd Lake, their sons Jack and Dale of Florida, Steve of Kennebunk and Brett of Howland, Howard "Hap" A. Horne of Milo and his children, Jason



and M. Briget of Brownville, Jill and Jeremy Carey of Milo and Jeff of Milo, three daughters, Linda H. 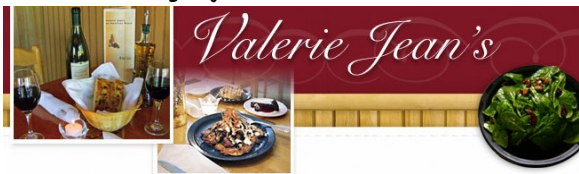
