WHAT'S UP DOC?

Hi Folks!

I received the following question and I feel that it is particularly appropriate for this time of year when we are all active.

Q: What is the first course of action when we hurt ourselves - Our neck, back, shoulder etc? Heat or Ice?

A: As a rule of thumb, ice is the first choice. The ice will help keep the swelling to a minimum. 15-20 minutes of ice should suffice 3 times daily for 2-4 days, then try heat.(3 times daily for 15-20 minutes) If heat feels good, stay with it until the pain subsides: Essentially you want to apply ice to slow the swelling as it expands:then apply heat as the swelling starts to reduce.

That's all folks!
