Town of Milo MINUTES Selectmen's Meeting

May 4, 2010

MEMBERS PRESENT: Bobby Ade, Donald Banker, Jerry Brown, Richard Mullins, Wilma Stanchfield and Jeff Gahagan.

MEMBERS ABSENT: None. **STAFF:** Betty Gormley.

6:30 PM Call to Order by Jerry Brown, Chairman.

MINUTES: Richard made the motion to approve the minutes of April 20th as prepared. Second - Don. Passed - unanimously.

CORRESPONDENCE: Jeff read a letter to the Board commending Officer Damien Pickel for the outstanding job he recently did regarding a case. This letter will be going in his personnel file.

PUBLIC COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS: None.

AGENDA: POLICE RIDE-ALONG POLICY: Bobby made the motion to table this discussion until the Chief can be available for this.

RIVERFRONT UPDATE: Jeff informed the Board that the work at the Riverfront is going well. Jeff handed out the change order with the new changes. The blueprints have also been changed. The changes to the plans cost \$7,997.51. This does not include any CES fees. The boat landing parking lot will

be keeping the same amount of parking spaces. Jeff is still



negotiating on some of the fees. He will keep everyone updated.

ATV MUD RUN UPDATE: Bobby informed the Board that there was a meeting May 3rd for the mud run. The mud runs will be at the Industrial Park in front of the barn. All that needs to be done now is contacting vendors and advertising. Jeff Beaulieu will be DJ for the street dance. None of the events will be using taxpayer money. There will be no issues regarding the beer tent because Bobby Ade already has a liquor license. The only thing needed will be a barrier.

MILO HISTORICAL SOCIETY PROJECT UPDATE: Jeff informed the Board that the work started today at the Historical Society. The contractor, Joe McSwain, borrowed the jack hammer from the Water District. This made their work a lot easier getting the walkway out. Joe thinks the job will take approximately 10 weeks. They should be done by the time the Historical Society opens in July. Jeff informed Joe that the gutters also need to be replaced but weren't budgeted for. Joe stated he may be able to help.

CCA UPDATE: Jeff informed the Board that he sent an e-mail to Marcello stating the Town was still interested in working together and updated him on the sewer line project and the wells. Marcello responded very quickly and he said he is interested in possibly working together. Jeff will be sending a letter to the new CEO regarding the timeline, correspondence, objectives and the sewer line project along with the wells.

Jeff is also working on getting a sign at the Industrial Park.

DOCK PURCHASE: Jeff informed the Board that a 24' extension with 2 fingers will cost \$5500. There is \$6800 available in the dock fund account. This purchase would create 4 new spaces. Bobby made the motion to have Jeff purchase the extensions. Second - Richard. Passed -unanimously.

Richard made the motion to approve Gary's recommendation letter requesting a building at the cemetery. Second - Wilma. Passed - unanimously.

OTHER:

- Jeff read a resignation letter from Officer David Henderson to the Board. David has accepted a position with the Dover-Foxcroft Police Department. Richard made the Motion to accept Officer Henderson's letter of resignation with regret. Second - Bobby. Passed - unanimously.
- Jeff updated the Board regarding the trees being cut on the Hobbstown Road by Denis Gagne. Denis has brought the first check in for approximately \$800. 1 acre in the area can not be cut due to the vernal pools in the area. Jeff received a call from a

concerned resident in regards to the culverts and the road. Jeff had Denis call him to discuss this matter.

- Jeff informed the Board that a concerned citizen called in regards to the basketball court on Riverside Street. The court needs to be resurfaced. Dickie said he would be able to come up with the money. Harvey Paving quoted a price of \$1500 to fix it and Public Works can repaint the lines.
- Jeff informed the Board that there is a continuing problem again this year with kids on bicycles around town taking jumps at the cemetery and the town lots. The Police and Jeff have spoken with them but it has not helped. Gerrish's has stated to Dickie that they will donate some dirt to put down at the ice skating rink and jumps will be made for them there.
- Jeff informed the Board that the residents on Deer Run Drive have finally formed a Road Association. This should cut down on the complaints coming from that area. They have posted a Notice of Meeting and a Warrant. They are electing Officers. All seems to be going good.
- Jeff handed out a rough building sketch for the garage at the cemetery. The building will be a 28' x 42' 3-bay garage with an office, kitchen, bathroom and maintenance area. Jeff would like to have a Public Hearing for approval of the money being used from the Cemetery Trust Fund. Bobby made the recommendation of making the building 32' or 34' x 42'. The costs would not change much.

Bobby made the motion to proceed with the public hearing. Second - Richard. Passed - unanimously.

NEW/UNFINISHED BUSINESS: Treegrowth Supplemental:

Bobby made the Motion to sign the tree growth supplementals as prepared. Second - Richard. Passed - unanimously.

Supplemental: Richard made the motion to sign supplemental as prepared. Second - Bobby. Passed - unanimously.

Abatement: Richard made the motion to sign abatement as prepared. Second - Don. Passed - unanimously.

Bobby made the motion to adjourn at 7:10 PM. Second - Richard. Passed - unanimously.

Town of Milo MINUTES Selectmen's Meeting May 18, 2010

MEMBERS PRESENT: Bobby Ade, Donald Banker, Jerry Brown, Richard Mullins, Wilma Stanchfield and Jeff Gahagan.

MEMBERS ABSENT: None. **STAFF:** Betty Gormley. 6:30 PM Call to Order by Jerry Brown, Chairman.

MINUTES: Richard made the motion to approve the minutes of April 20th as prepared. Second - Bobby. Passed - unanimously.

CORRESPONDENCE: Jeff informed the Board that the Selectmen, Town Office and Jeff received a card from Bertha Larson thanking everyone for the flowers that were sent to her for her surgery.

Jeff read a letter from the Atkinson Fire Department thanking Milo for their past fire protection.

Jeff read a letter of resignation from Ashley Monahan as reserve police officer.

Richard made the motion to accept Ashley Monahan's letter of resignation with regret. Second - Bobby. Passed - unanimously.

PUBLIC COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS: Franklin Stover recently bought 185 Park Street. He just wanted to let the Selectmen know that he thought Milo was definitely a friendly town and he was meeting a lot of wonderful people.

AGENDA:

POLICE RIDE-ALONG POLICY: Jeff drafted a policy for the Police Department regarding having people ride along with them in the cruisers. Jeff stated that there were a couple areas that he and the Chief disagree on. Jeff read some of the policy to the Board and the public. Jeff's policy stated that only police or police-related individuals can ride in the cruisers. Chief Williams stated his position to the situation. He feels that he should be allowed to have his family with him while he is on call. He wants to be able to drop his kids off at school or at the field during games. He thinks it is good for the public to see him out with the cruiser and seeing that his family is important to him. Chief has compared this situation with other towns and some towns allow the chief to use a cruiser as their personal vehicle within the town that they work.

Chief suggested starting a Policy Committee which would consist of the Town Manager, one Selectmen, the Chief and a couple citizens. Their job would be to look at all of the Town's policies and update them.

Jeff talked about the public's perception. He is getting many calls regarding the Chief using the vehicle for personal use.

Some of the public thinks that it is a good idea if he uses the cruiser while he is taking call time. Another concern was that if there was a call, he would have to choose between the public and his family's safety. The Chief's wife, Amy, wanted to let everyone know that he would not put his family in danger. If a call comes in, he drops her off and comes and gets her after the call.

Wilma felt that he should be able to have access to the cruiser but not to allow the family to ride with him.

Richard made a Motion to go along with Jeff's draft of the Police Policy. Second - Wilma. Passed - Brown, Mullins and Stanchfield in favor; Ade and Banker against.

Bobby made the motion to put together a Policy Committee to look at all the town's policies. Second - Wilma. Passed - Ade, Banker, Brown and Stanchfield in favor; Mullins against.

RECYCLE BIN LOCATION DISCUSSION - Prospect Street Concerns: Bobby made the motion to not have the recycle bins located on the corner of Prospect Street and Park Street. Second - Richard. Passed - unanimously.

Richard made a motion to put the recycle bins at the Industrial Park at the southwest corner of the barn. Second - Bobby. Passed - unanimously.

BOUNDARY LINE DISCUSSION W/FRANKLIN STOVER:

Frank Stover has requested to purchase 1 acre of land for \$4,000 and closing costs at the Industrial Park to bring his trailer into compliance with the setbacks. The tongue of the trailer is over the property line. Jerry stated that he was concerned with the selling of any land at the Park due to the Charter. Jeff informed the Board that they would be allowed to vote on this tonight if they use the words "subject to Town vote" and then the townsspeople would need to vote on it. Bobby also thinks that since we are still in negotiations with CCA, we wouldn't be allowed to sell any land.

Richard made the motion not to accept the offer of \$4,000 from Frank Stover. Second - Bobby. Passed - unanimously.

LAND RENTAL DISCUSSION W/FRANKLIN STOVER:

Frank Stover is requesting that the Selectmen rent 1/4 acre of the land at the Industrial Park for him to use as a garden. He would like to pay \$50/season and 1/3 of the crop would go to the local food pantry.

Richard made the Motion to not accept the offer due to having to let more people do this. Second - Bobby. Passed - unanimously.

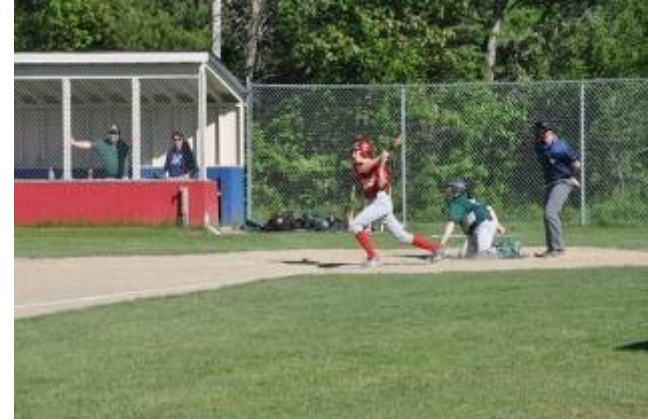
UPDATES:

- Jeff informed the Board that the Riverfront Project is coming along well. They should be finished in 3 weeks.
- Jeff informed the Board that the Historical Society project is making progress. They have gone back to their home base to construct the steeple base. This project should be completed in about another 10 weeks.
- Jeff informed the Board that the sewer project will be going out to bid real soon. Construction should start mid-June.
- Jeff informed the Board that an issue with the Hobbstown woodlot has come up. Gary Cook informed Jeff that the Federal Government had given that land to the Town under the stipulation that the wood not be cut. The Town had no deed for this property and no way to get a deed. Gary may have a copy of one. Cutting has stopped there at this time.
- Jeff informed the Board that the ATV mudrun is moving along well. Brochures have been placed around town for advertisements. The KI Riders are the sponsors with the Recreation Department being co-sponsors. There will be vendors at the event.

OTHER:

- Jeff informed the Board that a Black-Fly Festival is being set up for July 3rd. They had a meeting last week and another meeting will be on Thursday. Many different events are being set up.
- Jeff informed the Board that the Water District meeting went well. Timmy did well with the presentation. They need to increase their rates on water for debt due to being out of compliance.

Appointments: Bobby made the motion to sign appointments as prepared. Second - Don. Passed - unanimously.

Other: Jeff informed the Board that he would like to have an extension done for the charter commission to allow for time for completion.

Richard made the Motion to extend the charter commission. Second - Bobby. Passed - unanimously.

Other: Jeff informed the Board that a public hearing has been set for June 1st at 6:30 PM followed by a regular Selectmen's Meeting.

Adjournment: Bobby made the motion to adjourn at 7:30 PM. Second - Richard. Passed - unanimously.

Twenty-four years of summer reading programs in our history and now we're about to embark on number twenty-five. If you've been reading this article over the past few weeks you already know all about it and that the theme is 'Make a Splash' Read! " Rochelle and I are working on making it a little special this year by trying out some new things.

Two days ago we accessed the streaming video from Eastern Illinois University's Thut Greenhouse in Charleston, Illinois. Why? Because we had a once in a lifetime opportunity to watch the rare, tropical flower, Titan Arum, come into bloom. More commonly known as the corpse flower, due to its foul odor, this rare plant only blooms every few years and sometimes decades. The blossom lasts just one night before it begins to close. Since the only place it grows wild is in the tropical forests of Sumatra, Rochelle and I were thrilled to be able to watch it from the library's monitor and share the experience with our patrons.

Now, in keeping with the theme of the Make a Splash program, we are currently showing live, streaming video of the Boston Aquarium.

There's nothing quite like checking out a book and watching a shark swim by.
