6:30 PM Call to Order by Richard Mullins, Chairman Pro Tem.

MINUTES:

Don made the Motion to approve the Minutes of May 18th as prepared. Second – Wilma. Passed – unanimously.

CORRESPONDENCE: None.

PUBLIC COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS: None.

AGENDA: FIRE CONTRACTS:

Jeff informed the Board that the Lakeview and Medford Fire Contracts were completed.

Wilma made the Motion to approve and sign the Lakeview and Medford Fire Contracts as prepared. Second – Don. Passed – unanimously.

CHRIS REARDON - GRANTS: Jeff informed the Board that Tom Kittredge of PCEDC was leaving his position to go to Belfast to work. Chris Reardon spoke to the Board on what his job consists of. He discussed different options for the Town to do, if the Town were to hire him. His paycheck comes from the Grant money and not from the Town. The Town may need to pay for small initial things at times, for example, copies.

FINANCIAL UPDATES: Robin went through all the accounts to inform the Board if they were under or over the budget. Most accounts were under and the ones that were over would be under in a couple months due to certain payments or circumstances. The overall budget is doing real well.

UPDATES:

- Jeff informed the Board Dickie was doing a wonderful job at Harris Field. The Public Works Department did some trimming also at the Field. Michael Witham brought down his chipper as a donation to help with the trimming. Jeff wanted to thank Mike for his offer.
- Horseshoe pits were put in by the American Legion.
- The drag equipment was used by the cemetery for the roads.
- The art class at the High School were working on repainting the sign at Harris Field and then would be starting on another one.
- Public Works is working on ditching. This is keeping them busy. They will be starting to get their uniforms through Cintas instead of Unifirst soon.
- Police Department received a \$9,000 grant to be used for equipment. They plan on getting a few more tasers. They did a real good job on the Memorial Day Parade.
- The Fire Department is doing a good job.
- The Library is doing well. Joe Green is doing a wonderful job cleaning the building and keeping the lawn mowed. He works more than his 5 hours without being compensated.
- The Mud Run is progressing good. The field has been petitioned off for the run.
- The 4-H Club is doing a good job with their garden at the Industrial Park.

Abatement – The Restaurant: Chuck and Joi Stevens wrote a letter to Jeff requesting an abatement on their property – The Restaurant. Judy Macdougall mentioned Ann Hood's *The Red Thread*, which is about Asian adoptions and therefore tied into Anne Tyler's *Digging to America*, which we read recently. This month's reading was a selection of short stories; Barbara Crossman led the discussion. She started by reading portions of an introduction to reading short fiction from an anthology of short stories. We talked about why we did or didn't like reading short stories--some of us liked to be able to complete the whole thing in one sitting, while others felt that we barely get engaged when the story is over. Barbara read an interesting essay by Shirley Jackson about her story "The Lottery"; apparently it was immediately recognized as disturbing, touching a nerve in many readers from its first publication in 1948. Most of the group were less enthusiastic than they had expected to be about E. B. White's "The Door," having been familiar with some of his other work. We also
