## 4-H'ers finish up summer program at PVHS, prepare care packages for soldiers in Afghanistan

Milo 4-H concluded a successful summer program last Tuesday, July 27 at Penquis Valley High School. 15 members of 4-H from Brownville and Milo gathered together to make air rockets, tie-dye t-shirts, learn nutrition, make healthy snacks, and play teambuilding games each Tuesday of July. The program also successfully finished a service project, sending care packages to soldiers serving in Afghanistan. The program focused each week on one of the 4 H's: Head, Heart, Hands, and Health. The day began with a discussion of the 4-H Pledge, followed by activities to enhance member understanding of pledge.

### Learning the meaning of 4-H Pledge

Week One of Summer 4-H focused on understanding the Heart H. Every 4-H'er pledges his or her Heart, "For Greater Loyalty." To learn more about loyalty, 4-H invited Marine Sergeant Michael Hurley to speak about loyalty to his country and his decision to serve in the armed forces. 4-H'ers then decided to undertake a service project to help soldiers serving

in Afghanistan by sending care packages of DVD's, snacks, notebooks, pens, and crossword puzzles.

For Week Two, 4-H'ers discussed the Head H, which they pledge, "For Clearer Thinking." Members built PVC pipe rocket launchers and experimented with building the perfect Rocket to launch into the air. Students also experimented with making bubbles and were led in an origami activity by 4-H'er Cora Bailey.

Week Three taught 4-H'ers about the Health H. 4-H'ers learned yoga and played other outdoor games. 4-H'er Rachel Whitten led the group in making Cucumber Salad. Sue Henner, of the Eat Right program from Piscataquis County Cooperative Extension, visited the program to share her knowledge of nutrition and make fruit smoothies.

The final week was "Hands for Larger Service." 4-H'ers finished bringing in their care package materials. The group gathered enough material to ship out three boxes to a unit of 6 to 7 soldiers who are in the field. The program also



did craft activities to finish up the day.

On Friday, July 23, at the Milo Town Hall, Piscataquis County Cooperative Extension, the Extension 4-H Program, and employees of Milo Rite Aid held a spaghetti dinner, dessert contest, and silent auction to benefit 4-H Aide Linda Whitten and her family. Linda has struggled with illness over the past

year. The event raised \$2,549.00. Piscataquis County Cooperative Extension and 4-H would like to thank everyone for their generosity.

Following the dinner, an awards presentation was held recognizing the work of 4-H'ers and 4-H leaders from around the county. Linda and Willis Whitten were honored for over 32 years of service to 4-H and their community.

4-H also said a big thank you to Andy Barnes, VISTA member, who helped:

- Expand Milo 4-H Afterschool to include Brownville and Marion C. Cook Elementary Schools through his efforts with volunteers and school administrators,
- Work with MSAD 41 elementary schools to create 4-H afterschool blogs on school sites to tell of their program progress & learn skills,
- Teach photography, blogging, and audio recording to 4-H youth and help each student feel they belong to the program,
- Coordinate a field trip for all three schools at UMaine Campus;
- Coordinate with the Town of Milo, 4-H Volunteers, local businesses and civic organizations to create 4-H Learning Garden and a 4-H summer day program at PVHS;
- Plan with Laura Mallet, PVHS guidance counselor and Becky Collanino of Upward Bound to hold a College Application Clinic last November;
- Hold a Coffee Break for PVHS alumni at UMO, sending home finals care packages for the end of Fall 2009 semester;
- Work with the Milo Historical Society to further develop its *Our Town: Milo* oral history project to include a website and wrote a \$500 grant to host noted folklorist and oral historian Jo Radner in Milo for a training workshop.

- The Public Works is busy doing ditching around the Town.
- The Police Department has a speed limit lighted sign which is being moved to different streets around town. The sign will be used on Park Street this weekend for the Mud Runs.
- The Police Department is in the process of hiring more reserve officers.
- Wilma Stanchfield did a letter to Lori Anthony to re-evaluate the speed limit on the Medford Road.
- Robin informed the Board that there were only 2 accounts that were of any concern being over budget. The Library is over budget because Judy was paid her vacation pay when she retired in May. This should even out as the year goes on. Pam will be asked to watch the book line account. The other account is The Harris Field Account. This is over budget because they started working down there a month earlier than expected. Dickie has done a lot of work down there. He is doing a wonderful job. This line should also even out by year end.

**OTHER - CHRIS RHODA:** Jeff spoke to the Board regarding the Tax Acquired Property that Chris Rhoda has purchased recently for \$8750. The Mortgage Holder research process did not show any mortgage holders under the owner's name of Veronica Keaten. Since the purchase of the land, 2 mortgage holders have come forward. They were listed under the previous owner's name of Mona Lambert. Jeff recommends refunding Chris Rhoda the money he paid and then the mortgage company will pay the taxes.

Richard made the Motion to refund Chris Rhoda his money in the amount of \$8750. Second - Bobby. Passed - Ade, Banker, Mullins and Stanchfield in favor; Brown abstaining due to his relationship to Chris.

**OTHER - NOEL MUSSON:** Noel Musson from CES spoke to the Board regarding all the projects that are going on in Milo.

Historical Society Project - The quality of the work is very good even though the job is moving slowly. Charleston Correctional will be constructing the wheelchair ramp. Jeff will check into see when they will be available to do this.

Riverfront Project - The lights will be starting on June 20<sup>th</sup>. The project is almost done. Noel will be checking with RA Paradis to see what the guarantee is on their landscaping work.

Veterans' Memorial Park - Noel recommends having a ceremony for this park.

Facade Program - Noel stated that this project was \$50,000 which targets 5 businesses in the downtown area. This money needs to be attempted to be used before it can possibly be used for something else. Noel would like to get the application process started as soon as possible. He will do a final draft and get it to Jeff for final approval. He recommends that it be on a First Come, First Served basis. Noel will also be checking to see if buildings which are for sale will be eligible for this money. He also recommends that there be a stipulation to have owners repay the town on a sliding scale if their properties are sold within so many years. He will be getting a definite answer on the exact area for this money to

be used. Once the application is approved, then advertising will be done and a mailing will go out to the business owners. Noel thinks this work can start by the end of the summer.

**OTHER - FUEL BIDS:** Only 2 bids were received for fuel. One from McKusick's for 2.689/gal. and one from A.E. Robinson for 2.7425/gal. Both bids are with the Downside Protection. The furnace plans are very similar for both companies. Jeff recommends staying with McKusick's.

Bobby made the Motion to go with McKusick's for fuel. Second - Wilma. Passed - unanimously.

**OTHER - SCHOOL BOARD BUDGET REFERENDUM:** Bobby made the Motion to sign School Board Budget Referendum as presented. Second - Richard. Passed - unanimously.

**OTHER - CEMETERY BUILDING:** Jeff spoke to the Board regarding the construction of a cemetery building. Noel is estimating the cost to be \$100/sq. foot. Jeff would like to use the interest earned on the Cemetery Trust Fund which is around \$95,000. A Special Town Meeting is needed for approval to use these funds. Specific information would be needed first including the building plans so that everyone bidding would be bidding on the same information.

Richard made the Motion to word the Warrant Article to "spend up to \$95,000." Second - Don. Failed - Mullins in favor; Ade, Banker, Brown and Stanchfield against.

Bobby made the Motion to table this discussion until Jeff has more information. Second - Don. Passed - unanimous.

**NEW/UNFINISHED BUSINESS: Off Premises Liquor License:** Richard made the Motion to approve the Off Premises Liquor License for Robert Ade to have a beer tent during the ATV Mud Runs on June 19<sup>th</sup>. Second - Don. Passed - Banker, Brown, Mullins and Stanchfield in favor; Ade abstaining due to it being his application.

**Other:** Jeff spoke to the Board regarding the fatal car accident in Orneville during the winter. A bill was submitted for \$3,496.50. The County requested that the Town of Milo stay to help with traffic duty. Now the County is wondering why Milo stayed so long. They feel the bill is too high and they are requesting to take \$1,350 off the bill. Richard made the Motion to have the bill stay as is. Second - Bobby. Passed - unanimously.

**Other:** Richard made the Motion to sign Appointments for Robert Cook and Adam Moir for Reserve Police Officers as presented. Second - Bobby. Passed - unanimously.

**Adjournment:** Bobby made the Motion to adjourn at 8:15 PM. Second - Don. Passed - unanimously.

## Milo Free Public Library News

What kind of value can the average patron put on their local library? I'm so glad you asked. The Maine State Library has created a calculator for the simple purpose of answering that question.

The website is here at <http://www.maine.gov/msl/services/calculator.htm> For those that don't have ready access to a computer, I'll crunch some numbers for you.

Let's keep it moderate. The calculator is designed to total the numbers by month so we'll start with reading one book a week. Let's throw in two paperbacks for that month and a magazine. Make that two. We'll want some beach reading after all and we



wouldn't want to go without reading our Sports Illustrated or Downeast.

If you had youngsters that attended the Summer Reading Program, we'll want to add in four hours or so for that and a few children's books. If you have more than one child or a child that loves to read, eight children's books a month is a fairly conservative amount to add to your borrowed books list.

Did you check your email? Need to print out your vacation e-ticket? Maybe you were doing some job hunting online. A half hour twice a week for the month is a good estimate. Perhaps you have a reference question for your librarian. Looking for a specific book or have genealogy questions? Maybe you just need to know how many door-knobs are in the United States (two million). We'll narrow it down to a question a week, just for fun. Perhaps you came in every Wednesday and read our copy of The Observer.

Maybe you or a family member just want to work on getting your GED or need help with those first steps for getting into college. The Penquis Valley Adult Education Cooperative has a representative here to help with that, every Monday afternoon at two p.m.

Using these circulation estimates and the Library Use Value calculator you just saved \$341.00 this month. Imagine what you could save for a whole year. The figures are averages the out of pocket cost for patrons to purchase the books, magazines and services that are free for use at you public library. For example, the computer usage is a sample hourly rate at internet cafes for people using their computers, not their own laptops.

Last month, with the summer reading program in full swing, the Milo Free Public Library loaned out 585 books and had an average computer use of 107 hours. According to the calculator, that's a savings for our patrons of \$10,830.00. Just imagine what it would be for the year.
