Town of Milo MINUTES Municipal Office Selectmen's Meeting
July 6, 2010

MEMBERS PRESENT: Bobby Ade, Donald Banker, Jerry Brown, Richard Mullins, Wilma Stanchfield and Jeff Gahagan. **MEMBERS ABSENT:** None. **STAFF:** Betty Gormley and Robin Larson. 6:30 PM Call to Order by Jerry Brown, Chairman.

MINUTES: Richard made the Motion to approve the Minutes of June 15th as prepared. Second – Bobby. Passed – unanimously.

CORRESPONDENCE: Jeff received a letter from Shannon Bishop stating her resignation to the MSAD #41 School Board due to relocating in Williamsburg. The Selectmen can appoint a member until the March Town Meeting. Richard made a Motion to accept Shannon's resignation with regret. Second – Bobby. Passed – unanimously. Jeff read a letter from George Walls with Unifirst. Jeff, Robin and Glenn decided to start getting the uniforms through Cintas which would be a savings to the Town. Unifirst is now suing the Town for breaking the contract. Erik Stumpf is working on this and says it is not a binding contract because it does not have an authorized signature.

PUBLIC COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS: Richard wanted to inform the Board that he has spoken with Barry from Don's Electric in regards to the new light poles. Some were damaged during shipment but new ones should be up within a week or two.

AGENDA: ATV TRAIL REVIEW: Jeff informed the Board that there were 3 different components to this issue. The first issue is the review of the ATV trail going from C & J's to Pat's Pizza. This was approved in 2007 for a 12-month period and should have been review in 2008. Jeff would like the Board to review it now. Chief Williams stated there has been no issues or problems with this extended trail. Dickie Martin stated that it was beneficial to the town and made Milo unique.

Richard made a Motion to approve ATV trail from EPIP to Hobnobbers and out Elm Street to Reuben's. No second. No action.

Chief stated that the ATV's should not be allowed to go across the bridge since this is a problem place for vehicles. Chief Williams stated that the KI Riders were

one of the best clubs and do a lot of their own policing but it still would not be good having them go through town.

Don made a Motion to continue the access as previously approved. No second. No action.

The second component that Jeff wanted to talk about is a complaint from a Milo resident concerning the ATV's on Park Street from the EPIP to C & J's and CC Polaris. This is within the 1500 ft. so is within the law.

The third component is the temporary ATV route on Lakeview Road to the Public Works Garage. Some people are not following the speed limits or getting over to the side of the road. The KI Riders are still waiting to hear from some of the property owners to make the trail across their land. They are trying to do an alternate route. This new temporary trail does not include the Medford Road. Many people are using the Medford Road anyways to get to the trails. Chief Williams stated that the Police need to be called when these ATV's are doing this.

Richard made a Motion to allow ATV's to go to House of Pizza and onto Elm Street by using High Street as long as the ATV's are registered and driven by a licensed driver. Second – Don.

Jeff wanted to state before a vote was taken that he does not recommend doing this due to the safety issue. The Chief also agreed that this would be a problem.

Vote: Banker and Mullins in favor; Brown and Stanchfield against; Ade abstaining. No action – did not pass.

Jerry suggested getting the specified neighborhood residents in for a Public Hearing before a vote was taken on this issue to get their feelings. There may also be alternate routes across some property owners to make this safer. David Preble stated that the KI Riders should decide what routes they think will be appropriate and come to the Selectmen themselves instead of the Selectmen making their trails. A sign will be put up at the Pleasant River Bridge stating "no ATV's beyond this point" heading out towards the Medford Road.

Bobby made a Motion to have the ATV trail to continue from Pat's Pizza to House of Pizza. Second – Don. Passed – Ade, Banker, Brown and Mullins in favor; Stanchfield against.

Jeff recommended having ATV parking in the Municipal Lot so they are not parking on the road. Jerry made the Motion to move to Departmental Updates. Second – Don. Passed – unanimously.

DEPARTMENTAL UPDATES:

- Richard wanted to state that the Public Works did a fantastic job on the culvert at the CD Center. This also made additional parking in the area.
- The Police Department is working on a new grant for \$9,400 for new equipment (cameras at the gazebo, landfill and Harris Field, a camera for the expedition, new tasers and uniforms).
- The Fire Department needs to do a hose test on one more truck. The ladder inspection will be done this month. Not much training is being done this year due to the budget.
- The Library is going well. The new Assistant Librarian (Rochelle Williams) is doing a wonderful job during the transition. They are in the middle of their Summer Reading Program. All the books have been bar coded and being checked in and out this way. Pam is still working on the downstairs.
- Dickie stated that probably 120 people participated in the Black Fly Festival. Bryan Russell and Brooke McLaughlin are doing a wonderful job. The summer programs include tee ball, farm league, basketball, tennis and golf. The golf is for children and adults. The mud run went well. Dickie has also been working on capital improvements for the Field which include \$1,100 for infield dirt material and 2 new Harris Field signs being done by Penquis students which Ronnie will clear coat and will be putting plexiglass on. There are new fence posts for the home run fence, a new water fountain by the tennis courts, new yellow plastic fence protectors (with the Fire Department donating \$100) and a new paint sprayer for the dugouts and buildings. Dickie purchased \$150 of paint at Bailey Lumber and another \$150 of paint donated by Bailey Lumber for dugouts, buildings and benches. The Recreation Department is planning a Softball Tournament with the proceeds going to Harris Softball Field. Kenny Williams will be running the tournament.

- Robin informed the Board that most accounts are well under budget with the rest being under by the end of the year. \$7,000 has been received for tree stumpage.

TRANSFER OF FORFEITED ASSETS: Jeff informed the Board that a case being worked on by Officer David Henderson. This case has \$465 in forfeited assets which will go to the Town of Milo with Selectmen's approval.

Bobby made the Motion to accept the \$465 in forfeited assets. Second – Wilma. Passed – unanimously.

DEED AFFIDAVIT FOR LANDFILL CLOSURE: Bobby made the Motion to sign Deed Affidavit for Landfill Closure. Second – Don. Passed – unanimously.

2010 TAX COMMITMENT: Bobby made the Motion to sign the 2010 Tax Commitment. Second – Richard. Passed – unanimously.

OTHER – Robin regarding employee helpers: Robin spoke to the Board regarding an Eastern Maine Development Program which helps troubled and challenged students find summer employment. The Town of Milo has applied for 3 helpers. One will be in the Town Office, one will be for the Recreation Department and one will help Glenn either at Public Works or at the Cemetery. We will have them for 6 to 8 weeks for 30 hours/week. They may be starting as early as next week. EMDC pays the employee and their Workers Compensation.

OTHER – Chris Reardon and Grant Information: Jeff reminded the Board that Chris Reardon had previously met with the Board to discuss grants. He is looking into getting a grant for a Public Safety Building. Matching funds could be any land used for the building. There is a \$24,000 minimum payment if land does not meet this requirement. There is a 3% funding to pay Chris and any upfront costs. It may be possible to use some land at the Industrial Park. A Town's vote will be needed to do this.

Bobby made the Motion to Table until Erik Stumpfel has a chance to look over the paperwork and to bring up at the next meeting. Second – Don. Passed – unanimously.

OTHER: Richard asked Jeff about the Municipal Park sign. Jeff will be meeting with Carl from AMB Signs when he comes for the signs at Harris Field. Richard wanted to inform the Board that the recycle bin should be here for use starting this week.

NEW/UNFINISHED BUSINESS: Appointments: Bobby made the Motion to sign all appointments as prepared. Second – Don. Passed – unanimously.

Other: Jeff spoke with Noel Musson regarding the Riverfront area. Parts of the walkway keeps washing away. There will be no charge this time to have R.A. Paradis come back to fix the areas. The problem is that it will probably need fixing again after another rain storm. To fix the problem so that it will not happen again, the cost will be \$2700. Jeff recommends paying to have this fixed and paying for it with grant money. The Board decided to have R.A. Paradis come back and fix it at no charge.

Other: Jeff informed the Board that there will not be another meeting in the month of July due to him taking a 2 week vacation. The next meeting will be August 3rd.

Bobby made the Motion to have the next Selectmen's Meeting August 3rd. Second – Richard. Passed – unanimously.

Adjournment: Bobby made the Motion to adjourn at 7:55 PM. Second – Richard. Passed – unanimously.
