

**A BIT OF VETERAN'S HISTORY**

Richard A. Mullins of Milo, member of Joseph P. Chaisson Post 41 shares a moment of history as a Korean War Veteran. Entering the United States Army Reserve at age seventeen, he was attached to a transportation Company as a truck driver. The Reserve was activated and he went to Fort Ord, California for basic training, then to Fort Sam Houston, TX attached to 321 Signal Corp, then to Fort Benning, GA for advance mechanic and Airborne



Jump School with the 101st Air Borne. Jump school required five jumps to qualify plus the physical and infantry tactics where upon graduation returned to Fort Sam Houston, Texas in

training for special operations. The Korean Armistice occurred July 27, 1953, but hostilities continued with little fan fare. In November 1953, Richard as platoon Sergeant of a special platoon made two jumps on Korean soil; the first jump was successful in freeing and recovering seven prisoners of war without casualties. The second jump was more difficult resulting in a firefight from make shift foxholes. A concussion grenade was thrown into a foxhole and a fellow trooper took the most impact with his body, Richard was injured by the concussion, but managed to be mobile enough to help free and recover five prisoners of war back to friendly lines some seventeen to twenty miles on foot. It would be Richard's last jump and he spent some time in a military hospital with fractured vertebrae's, eventually discharged and entered into public business and civil services. Presently retired and serving as a selectman for the Town of Milo. He has vast experience in community service.
