To the editor:

On Nov. 2, Maine people will have the chance to vote in support of the Land for Maine's Future (LMF) program. I encourage you to vote YES on Question 3. The LMF program has already guaranteed that 250,000 acres of working forest stay open for hunting, fishing, snowmobiling, hiking and other outdoor activities, while remaining in private hands managed for forest products.
