To the SAD 41 Area,
I've been thinking about writing this for a while, but I had a call this morning that prompted me to actually sit down and do it. Living in this area, it's easy to see that we live in communities that don't have a lot of resources or extra money. But in the last few weeks I've been so touched by how much residents want to do for our children, especially at this time of year.

Here at Brownville Elementary we installed a beautiful new playground last fall. A grant from the Maine Community Foundation was a critical piece, but so was money from our community. Some was raised by food sales, suppers and small contributions. A larger portion came from the donations of some local businesses. Now that I'm in the position of being a school principal, I can tell you they do it often, and in ways that no one ever hears about. We'd have far less without them.

Today I received a call from a lady on a fixed income. She thought this month she'd have an extra \$60 and wanted to buy some snow pants for children who needed them. I know she doesn't have extra money, but she wanted to do it because it's Christmas. So there are three little boys who will be warmer this year when they go out to play. We also had another donation containing two tubs of brand new winter jackets. One more act of generosity involves a group of senior citizens who play the card game "45". Each person donates \$1 a week to play. That group gave me a \$600 check to help needy children throughout SAD 41. This was done in memory of members who have passed away. Their money has purchased boots and a more few more jackets for needy children in every school.

So while I sometimes grumble to myself about what we're lacking, I'm constantly amazed and impressed by what we do have. Thank you one and all.

MILO TOWN HALL KITCHEN PROJECT

Heidi Finson, President of Three Rivers Kiwanis, announced today that the club has been given approval by the Board of Selectmen to launch a project to renovate the Milo Town Hall kitchen. Under present fire codes the stove can no longer be used until a hood with automatic fire suppression and a vent to the top of the roof are installed. In addition, the present gas stove is antiquated and needs to be replaced, the sink, plumbing, and counters are inadequate, and work space needs to be increased. The Town Hall is a designated emergency shelter, and must have a working, code-compliant stove to provide food if a need arises. In addition, the kitchen and adjacent dining room are used for many functions, such as the annual Kiwanis Veterans Appreciation Dinner on November 11, fund-raising needs for family crises and for community needs such as the Food Cupboard and emergency fuel assistance.

Kiwanians are hoping that community members will rally and donate as they are able to the funding of this project so that no tax money will have to be used. Three Rivers Kiwanis has made an initial donation of \$6000 to the project. A grant will also be sought to help with the funding.
